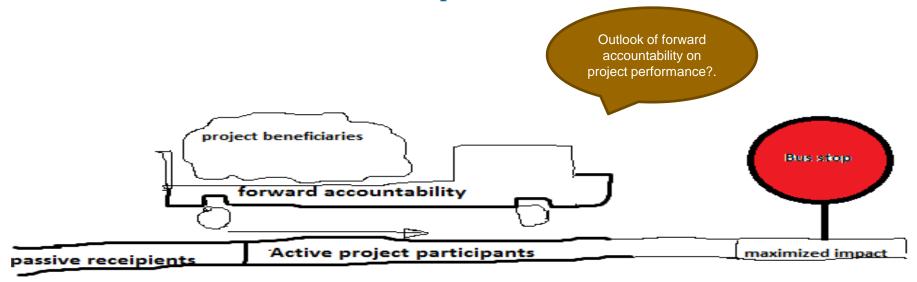

 - How do we measure these **routine** and **systematic** voice from project beneficiaries and act on them to improve project effectiveness and maximize impact.



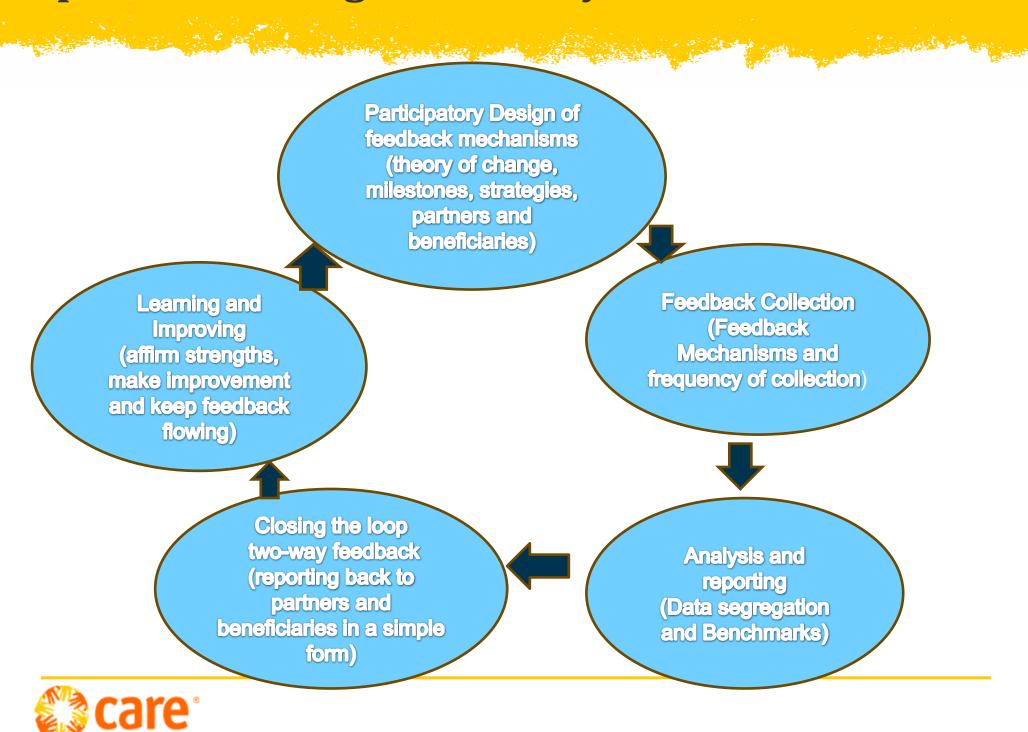
