GED responsibility in the new Strategic Talent Advisory and Planning (STAP) Committee

CARE USA's senior openings for the 2009 summer transfer cycle were announced recently via ALIMIS #6077. The selection process has changed this year and will closely resemble the standard recruitment/selection process. Each hiring manager will be responsible for managing a selection process for their positions and will make a recommendation to the Strategic Talent Advisory and Planning (STAP) on their final candidate(s). We encourage all interested staff to take advantage of this opportunity and are pleased to point out that one of the four core responsibilities of STAP is "Keeping gender equity and diversity at core of decisions."

Integration of GED indicator in Ubora

Gender and Diversity Balance in Staffing in the US and in Country Offices is now integrated as an indicator in Ubora - the organizational performance management system for CARE USA. The review of US based staff data (thanks to Angelena Jackson, HR Business Analyst in Atlanta) for the second quarter shows that we have a good gender balance but still have a long way to go in terms of increasing diversity of staff, especially at senior management levels. The CO diversity information could not be reviewed for all COs because of lack of information.
