Quick Updates

Approval of CI gender policy

The CI Executive Committee last month approved a CI policy on gender and diversity and asked that the CI Gender Network (which produced the policy) to establish a CI member level baseline in relation to the key commitments required by the policy. The Gender Network will then review this baseline every other year in order to measure implementation progress. While most CI members have already approved the policy, management teams of each member were asked to again review its provisions, and as needed agree steps to ensure their full realisation. An accompanying implementation guideline sets out mechanisms and common standards for all CARE members and Country Offices for increased accountability. Highlights from CO PSEA Pilots

CARE Ethiopia has been using a video titled "No Excuse" produced by Film Aid International to spread awareness on PSEA among staff. They plan to translate the video into local languages for use with communities. CARE Timor-Leste has conducted 10 workshops for 179 participants in the Dili head office and in the districts. In addition to orientation for all new staff, CARE Niger has established pilot complaints mechanism in two projects. CARE India conducted an awareness workshop with 10 staff identified as PSEA champions along with 14 members of the HIV program staff that work closely with vulnerable groups of sex workers. CARE Kenya produced and distributed 100 T-shirts with messages on SEA to refugees on International Women's day.

CARE Bangladesh PSEA Initiative

Senior GED Advisor visited CARE Bangladesh in late January and had the opportunity to observe the orientation of program participants that was carried out by using popular theater method and meet with some staff and partners. It was an extremely creative and attractive way to break the ice about a sensitive topic and orient community members on sexual exploitation and the ways to respond and report concerns.
