Gender Equality Matters in Humanitarian Action

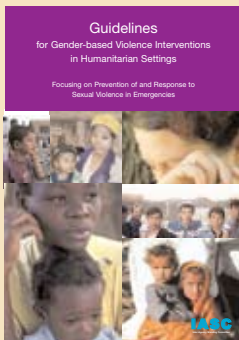
IASC announces an E-Learning course that will allow you to:

The IASC Gender Sub-Working Group (SWG) on Gender and Humanitarian Action, in collaboration with InterAction, is developing an e-learning course to help humanitarian workers mainstream gender strategies into their work. This course will provide illustrative examples to help you learn how to develop programming that ensures the needs and capacities of women, girls, boys and men are met in humanitarian situations.

Why should you take this e-learning course?

As a humanitarian worker, you often have little time to build your professional skills and strengthen your knowledge in humanitarian programming. This e-learning resource will allow you to learn how to develop effective programming during a time that is convenient for you.

This course will provide information and scenarios which will enable you to practice developing a more effective humanitarian response. By the end of this course, you will know the basic steps that a humanitarian worker must take to ensure gender equality in programming.

The course will include information on the core issues of gender and how it relates to other aspects of humanitarian response, such as nutrition, shelter, health and gender-based violence (GBV).
