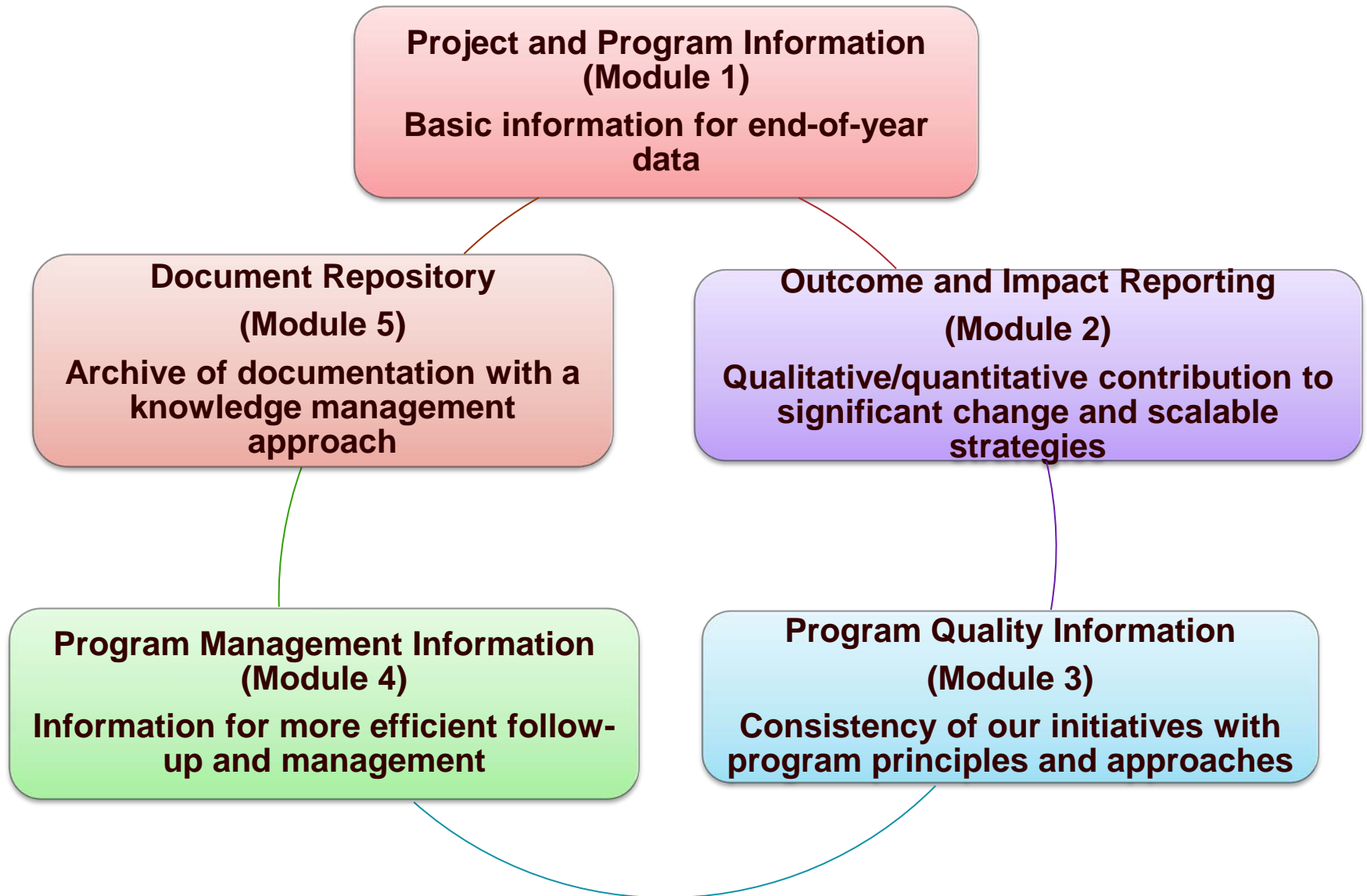


# What is PIIRS?

- A **CI-wide effort** a single platform for collecting, accessing and reporting relevant information on the work we are doing and what our work is achieving (**impact**).
- A system that strengthens **knowledge management** across the organization allows for stronger linkages with external stakeholders.
- A system that is **simple, cost-effective and user friendly**.
- A process led by CARE Australia, Canada, Netherland, UK, USA and the CI Secretariat



# PIIRS Modules



## Progress for Module 1

- A survey that obtained more than 100 responses on desired data categories for the system.
- Review and learning from experiences across CARE for basic project data (Ethiopia, Uganda, Tanzania, Bangladesh, Nepal and Peru)
- Data collection and report about CARE International key facts and figures for FY12 (global, regional and CI member reports).

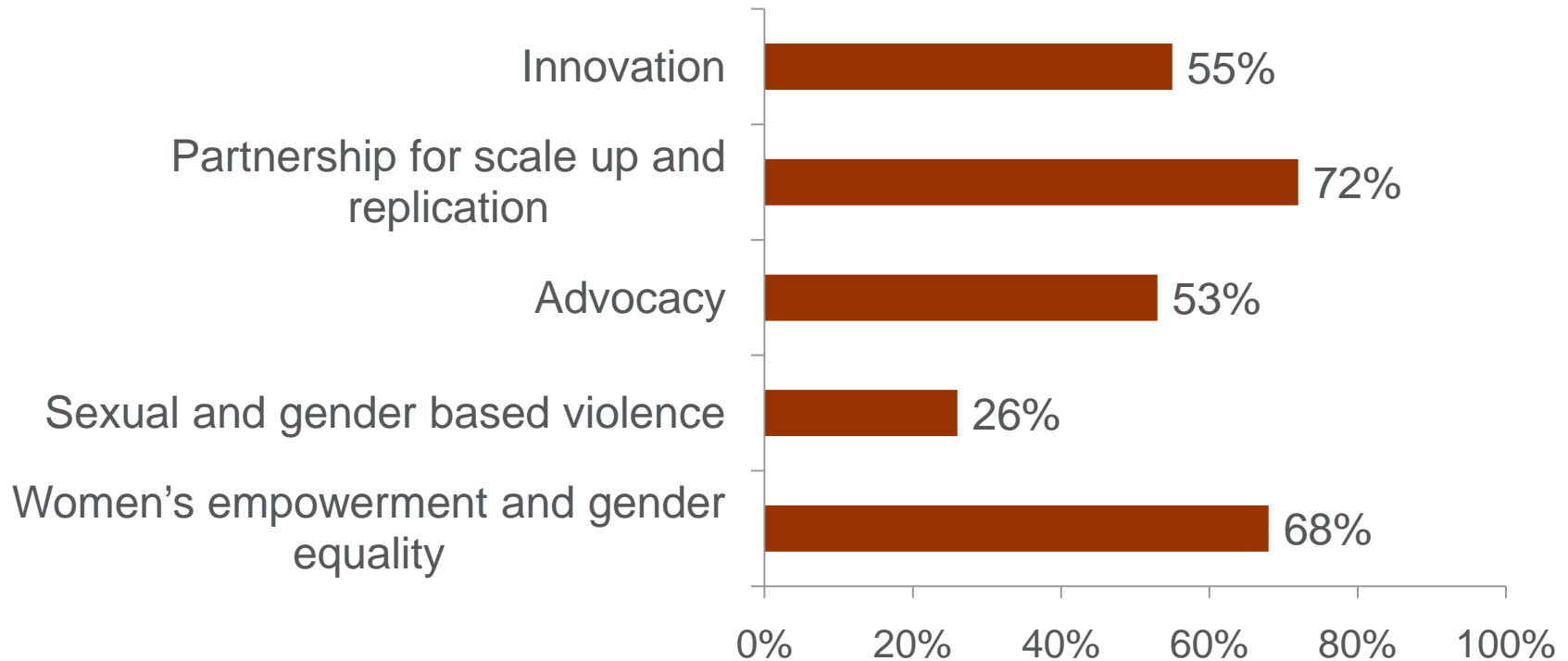

## Percentage of projects that include strategic elements

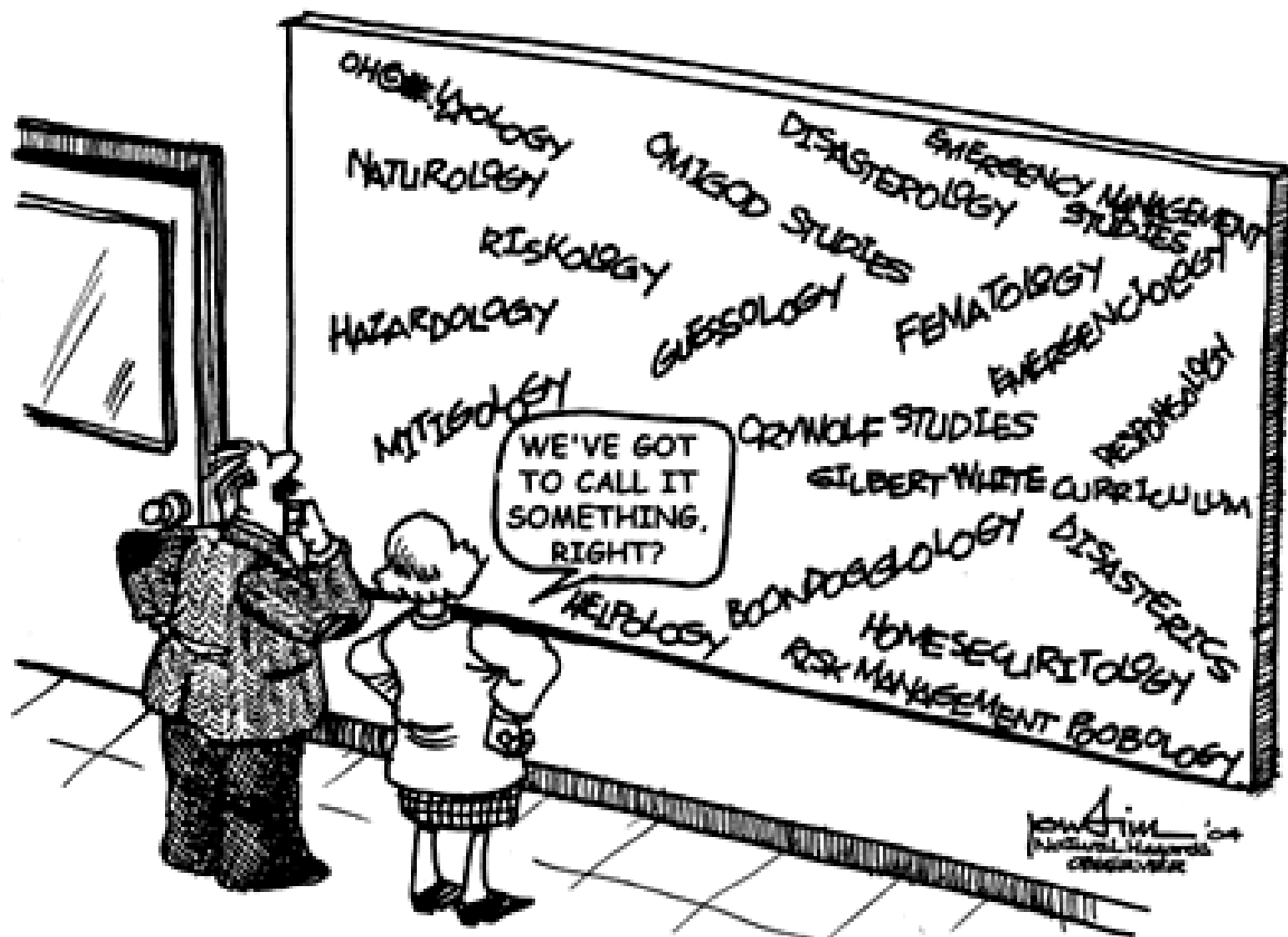


## Progress for Module 2

- Analysis of 14 successful internal impact measurement experiences, as well as external experiences (Action Aid, Oxfam, Plan, Save the Children, World Vision).
- A way forward for impact measurement at CARE (agreed to at a PIIRS meeting in November 2012) and for producing a **CARE yearly impact report**.



# The options we have for impact reporting



## CARE yearly impact report

- Yearly impact report featuring the depth of our work (one theme every year).
- Report that shows breadth of our work by including basic project data and aggregation of key indicators.
- External stakeholder survey showing how our contribution and impact is viewed by others.

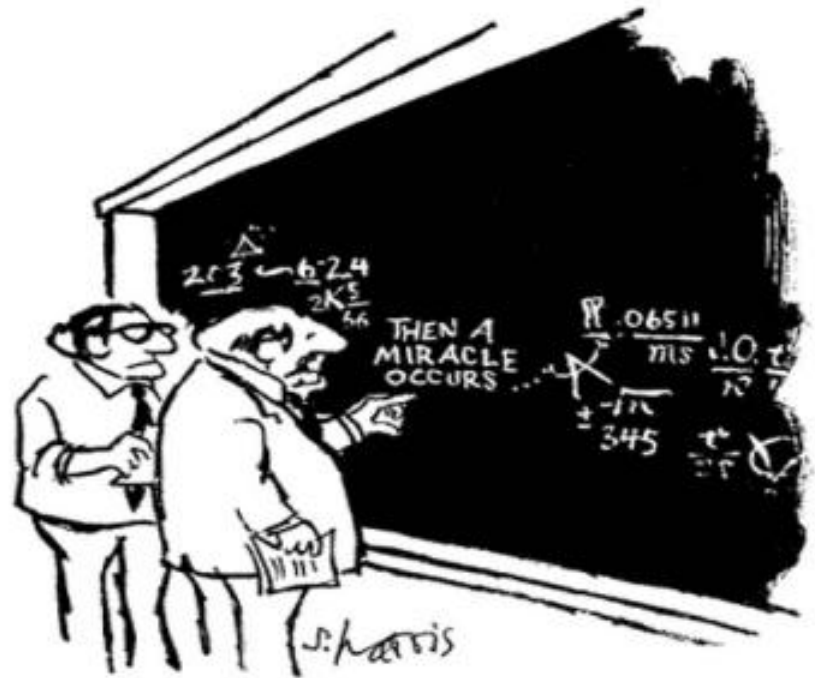


# Progress and plans for Module 2: Impact Reporting



Improve CARE's impact reporting at program level and strengthen the capacities required for this

- Define most appropriate methods for consolidating evidence of CARE's program impact.
- Provide technical assistance to programs for M&E.

# Some key issues as we make progress on PIIRS



- Realizing that what we measure is not just a technical decision, but a **political** one
- Deciding on **which projects and programs** to focus for measuring impact
- Using evaluations for deciding what to discontinue – what we will ***not*** do!
- Measuring **cost-benefit**

# Next steps for Impact Report



- Selecting GBV programs which will feature in CARE's global impact report and carrying out evaluations (if required).
- Producing impact report with a focus on GBV programs, including clear advocacy asks.
- Connecting the report with other organizational efforts (GBV campaign, etc.).
