






Progress for Module 2

- Analysis of 14 successful internal impact measurement experiences, as well as external experiences (Action Aid, Oxfam, Plan, Save the Children, World Vision).
- A way forward for impact measurement at CARE (agreed to at a PIIRS meeting in November 2012) and for producing a CARE yearly impact report.

Progress and plans for Module 2: Impact Reporting



CARE yearly impact report

- Yearly impact report featuring the depth of our work (one theme every year).
- Report that shows breadth of our work by including basic project data and aggregation of key indicators.
- External stakeholder survey showing how our contribution and impact is viewed by others.

First CARE Global Impact Report focusing on GBV. The report is ahead of schedule! (March 2014)




Progress and plans for Module 2: Impact Reporting



Improve CARE's impact reporting at program level and strengthen the capacities required for this

- Define most appropriate methods for consolidating evidence of CARE's program impact.
- Provide technical assistance to programs for M&E.

Some key issues as we make progress on PIIRS



- Realizing that what we measure is not just a technical decision, but a political one
- Deciding on which projects and programs to focus for measuring impact
- Using evaluations for deciding what to discontinue what we will *not* do!
- Measuring cost-benefit

Next steps for Impact Report



- Selecting GBV programs which will feature in CARE's global impact report and carrying out evaluations (if required).
- Producing impact report with a focus on GBV programs, including clear advocacy asks.
- Connecting the report with other organizational efforts (GBV campaign, etc.).
